We have the greatest children's leaders in the world. Each person who works with your child on Sunday morning is a volunteer who simply loves Jesus and His kids! Each teacher holds him/her self to high standards and considers it a privilege to serve Calvary Road Baptist Church through the SonCatchers Children's Ministry. The following are the expectations that each teacher strives to meet:

- 1. Have a personal relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ.
- 2. Be growing in his/her relationship with Jesus.
- 3. Be a positive Christian role model to each child under his/her influence.
- 4. Be faithful in his/her attendance to church and/or Sunday School.
- 5. Consistently participate in training that will further enhance classroom success.
- 6. Be prepared to welcome your child each morning by either 9:15 a.m. (for Sunday School) or by 10:45 a.m. (for Children's Worship).
- 7. Provide unconditional love to each child.
- 8. Cause every child to feel wanted, worthwhile, and appreciated in the classroom.
- 9. Pray, consistently, for every child assigned to the classroom.
- 10.Be well prepared with lesson content, and all other classroom activities.
- 11. Maintain a bountiful reservoir of patience.
- 12.Contact each child assigned to the classroom on a regular basis via postcard, phone call, or home visit.
- 13. Make every child, when absent, feel as though he/she was missed.
- 14. Attempt to build a healthy relationship with parents that will encourage an open and healthy dialogue concerning the well-being of each child assigned to the classroom.
- 15. Maintain availability to parents on an as-needed basis.
- 16.Be ready to minister to families when the need arises.
- 17.Ensure that every child assigned to the classroom is presented the Gospel message on a consistent basis and given an opportunity, with encouragement, to receive Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.
- 18.Inform parents, in a timely manner, of spiritual decisions made by children via the SonCatchers Children's Ministry "Decision Card."
- 19.Ensure that children in the classroom know what is expected of them regarding behavior. Further, communicate to children what is acceptable and what is not, and the consequences of noncompliance.

- 20.Create a healthy social environment:
 - ☆ Guiding relationships and friendships.
 - **☆** Guiding interpersonal attitudes, speech, and behavior toward one another.
 - ☆ Creating a "safe" social environment for every child.
- **21.Plan regular activities where kids can build relationships with the teacher and other classmates** (especially in the Sunday School program).
- 22.Communicate with parents concerning negative behavior before the problem gets out of hand.
- 23. Model forgiveness and provide each child a "clean slate" each week.
- **24.Be aware of each child's allergies and special needs** (when provided by the parent).
