What You Heard in the Word

- God wants us to pray. He said not to be anxious but to pray with thanksgiving and take our requests to him, and he will give us peace.
- ► The word ACTS helps us remember four types of prayer: Adoration—praising God; Confession—asking forgiveness for sin; Thanksgiving—thanking God; and Supplication—making requests for ourselves and others.
